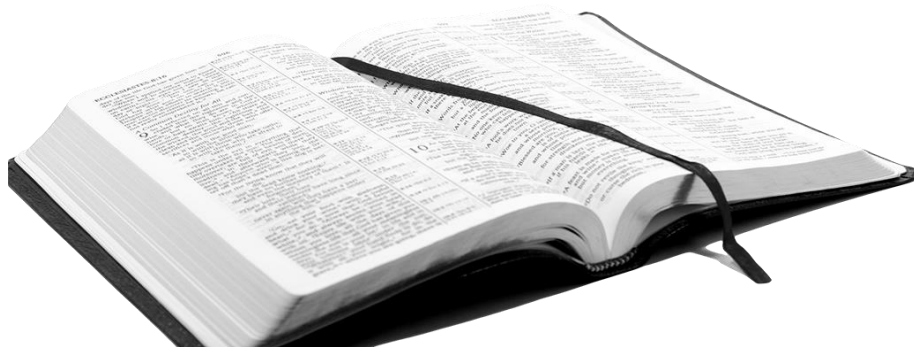

RECIPE – NOVEMBER: TOMATO & BASIL SOUP (Serves 6)

25 g butter
1 tablespoon olive oil
1 onion, finely chopped
1 clove garlic, chopped
900 g plum tomatoes, chopped
700 ml vegetable stock
125 ml dry white wine
2 tablespoons sun-dried tomato paste
2 tablespoons torn, fresh basil leaves
150 ml double cream
Salt & pepper.

- 1 Melt the butter in the olive oil in a large heavy-based saucepan, add onion and cook, stirring occasionally, for 5 minutes.
- 2 Add garlic, tomatoes, stock, wine and tomato paste, stir well and season to taste.
- 3 Partially cover the pan and simmer, stirring occasionally, for 20 - 25 minutes.
- 4 Remove saucepan from heat, and leave to cool slightly.
- 5 Transfer to a food processor or blender, (in batches if necessary), add the basil and process to a puree, then push the mixture through a sieve into the rinsed-out pan.
- 6 Stir the cream into the soup and reheat gently - but do not let it boil.
- 7 Ladle the soup into warmed bowls.



GARDENING NOTES - NOVEMBER

- 1 Stake young saplings and firm down loosened root balls well.
- 2 Mulch flower beds with a layer of leaves.
- 3 Treat water-logged areas with sand, and use a garden fork to create drainage holes in compacted areas.
- 4 Stop feeding fish - any food will end up rotting on the bottom of the pond, reducing oxygen levels.
- 5 Tidy up the herb garden, loosen the soil and add compost.
Mark position of non-hardy herbs, and cover lightly with a light mulch.
- 6 Bring any Mediterranean-type plants into the greenhouse.

There was 15 attended and after the service we all had a cup of tea and a biscuit. The collection will be going to the Disasters Emergency Committee appeals the Church will send £50.00

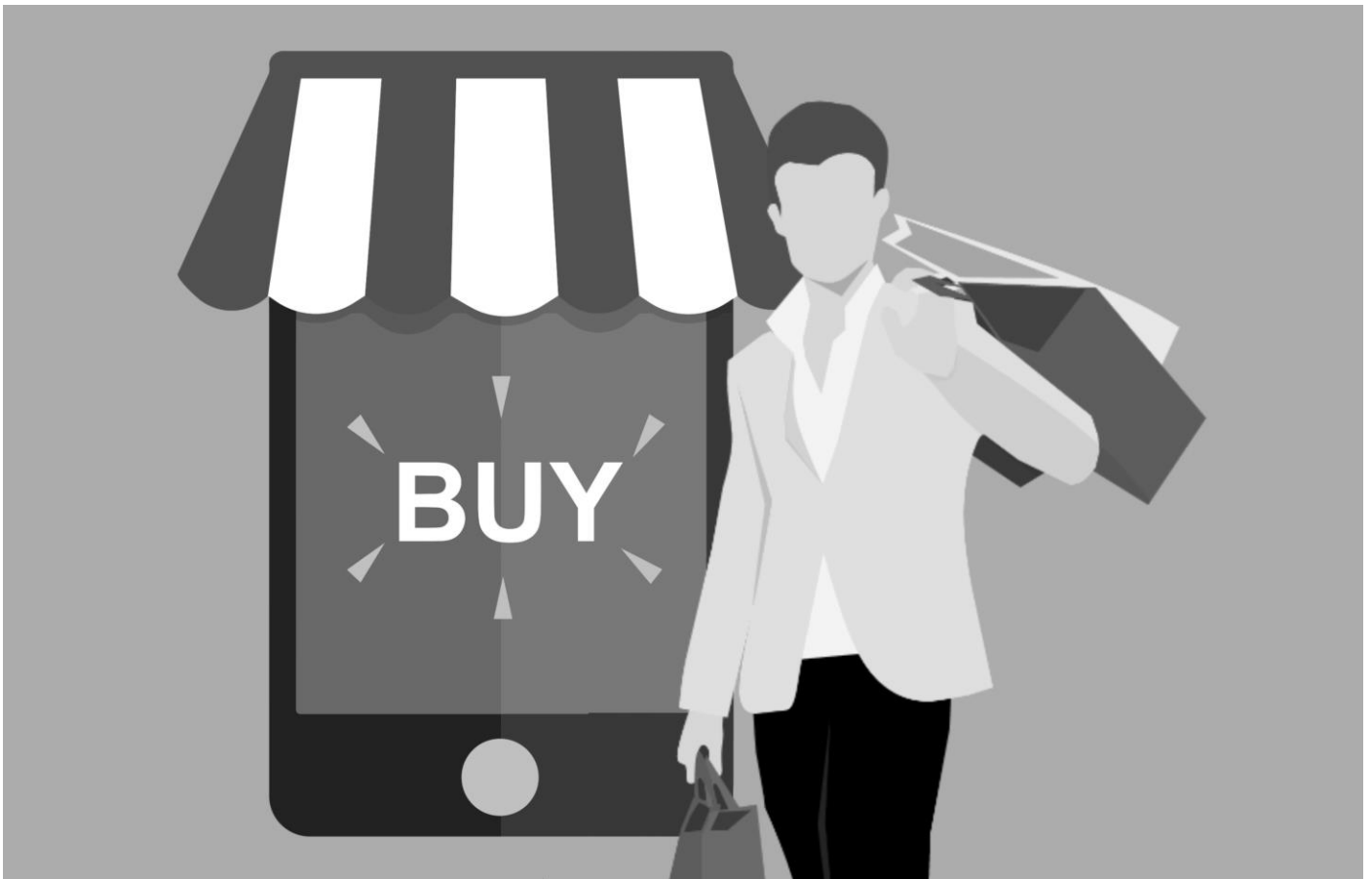

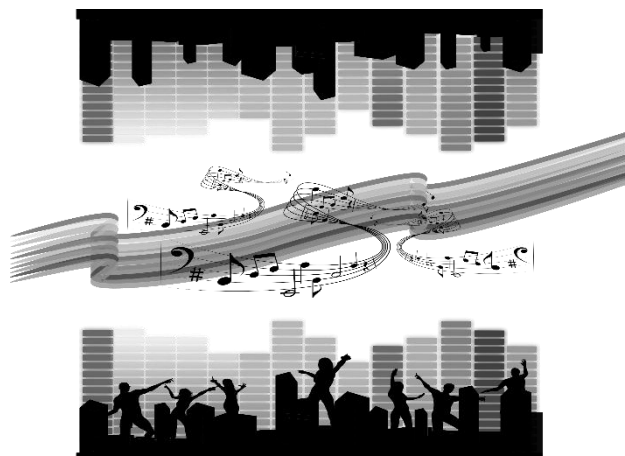
